Beginner Knitting!

Learn what projects are best for which types of yarns and how to substitute yarns. Short Row Workshop!

Short Rows are used to create shape in your knitting for many reasons. There are many types of Short Rows, and in this hands-on workshop we are going to explore in depth the most popular varieties. Learn how to make and resolve each and grow the confidence to tackle future projects that involve short rows.

While making this super cute cup cozy, you will learn all the secrets to magic loop, including casting on, avoiding ladders and converting patterns to magic loop.

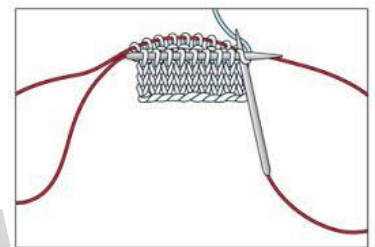

First Hat!

This winter proved you can never have enough hats! Get started for next year with this unisex textured stitch hat. Knit in-the-round from the bottom up, learn all basics of hat knitting including joining in the round, crown decreasing, and using Double Point Needles to finish the top. This is a great first project for knitting in-the-round! This hat can be knitted with or without a folded brim.

Mitered Squares are magical and so easy to create, join and turn into beautiful wearable items like this cowl. While working flat, learn to work central double decreases, how to pick up stitches, create I-cords and seaming. Finish off with a custom tag and keep or gift.

Once mastered, increases and decreases are added to create movement within the "lines". Choose two contrasting colors and watch the magic of brioche unfold.

We will also dig into brioche charts, common mistakes in brioche knitting and how to fix them. **Prior Brioche experience required.**

DK weight yarn makes these knit up fast and easy...a perfect first sock for wearing around the house! **Prior circular knitting experience required.**

Choose from solid or self-striping yarn options. **Must have Tunisian experience.**

Needle Felted Rabbit!

Who doesn't need a pair of beautiful bunnies for spring!?! This is an advanced beginner felting class that incorporates needle felting large and small shapes such as the cute carrots the bunnies are holding. The project is not so simple though that advanced felters won't also enjoy this project. Class will focus on felting techniques from start to finish, such as blending fibers and creating clean lines when working with multiple colors. Additional material will be provided to personalize your project.

Learn to Weave on a Rigid Heddle Loom!

Rigid Heddle weaving is an enjoyable and easy way to learn to weave beautiful projects. Your new 16" Ashford rigid heddle loom will be able to weave a variety of items.

In the first class, participants will learn the art of weaving on a rigid heddle loom. Attendees will learn the parts of the loom, weaving terminology, project planning, and to warp (dressing the loom with its vertical threads) and weave (placing the horizontal threads) to make a scarf.

The weaving of your beautiful scarf will be finished at home using your new skills. The second class will include removing the scarf from the loom and finishing the ends. The different ways weavers can finish their ends will also be discussed. Time will be given for weavers to re-warp their loom with a new project to reinforce the skills learned.

Advanced Color Techniques in Weaving!

Learn to weave with style on your rigid heddle loom with this log cabin pattern! Color and weave is a way that creates the illusion of complex, interesting and just a bit fancy patterns within plain weave. A rigid heddle loom is perfect for this fabulous pattern, which can be made using solid or self-striping yarn.

In this next step weaving class, participants **must** have a rigid heddle loom with a 7.5 dent reed and understand the basics of warping and weaving on their loom. Looms can be any width or brand. This class will teach the log cabin pattern, how to read a weaving pattern and hem stitching the ends (as opposed to tying knots). Participants can choose between weaving a scarf or table runner.
